On behalf of the American Psychological Association (APA), the organization representing 137,000 members and affiliates engaged in the practice, research, and teaching of psychology, I write to applaud your leadership, as Chairman of the Energy and Commerce Oversight Subcommittee, in undertaking a review of the mental health system, and for your dedication to crafting the Helping Families in Mental Health Crisis Act of 2013, legislation to improve the service delivery system for providers, patients, and families.

As a practicing psychologist in Congress, we know how important mental health is to you. We too seek to expand the provision of evidence-based, mental health services necessary for the well-being of children, adolescents and adults with mental disorders, including those with serious mental illness receiving treatment through the community mental health system, an integrated behavioral health and primary care network, or an in-patient setting.

Comprehensive mental health reforms, such as those proposed in your legislation, deserve attention by a broad range of behavioral health stakeholders, and we appreciate your outreach and consideration of our input.
